- Rock Engineering exam was 100% Recovered.
- SCO Exam
 - Yielded R 45 300.00 Incl Subs charged
 - 100% recovered.
- Slope Stability Seminar
 - Yielded R 33 500.00 and 100% recovered.
 - SANIRE is now awaiting shared profit from SAIEG
The Secretary and Mr. R. Armstrong were requesting to assist in communicating with SAIEG to receive SANIRE's portion before year-end.
- 100% Recovered for 2020.

The trend from Mining Companies continues:

- Incorrect payments are made monthly into the incorrect Association Accounts.
- This leads to Inflated / Deflated Amounts Reflecting in the Association Bank Accounts.
- Incorrect payments from the Mining Companies.

Change in landscape in terms of Association invoicing systems:

- Due to the new way of Invoicing adopted by most Mining Companies, we are required to submit Invoices via the various Portals Provided by the Mining Companies and attend their virtual training sessions.
- Portals are, SAP, Ariba, CSD & Coupa, each one varies from the other and has various criteria to submit before Invoicing can be done.
- Additional strain on the administration of the Associations and consume valuable time.

➤ Mr. R. van der Berg reported on the SANIRE recovery and noted that it is vital to recognize the amount of work that is going in from the Secretariat which reached the recovery rate of 3% outstanding debtors which

is commendable looking at previously SANIRE would be seating normally at a recovery of only 40% to 35% outstanding debts at the end of the year.

- It was requested that an email be sent out to all members with outstanding money to advise them that if it is not paid within a certain period their membership will be revoked. It was reported that majority of these outstanding debtors (79 members) are those people that write their SCO exams and disappear after writing.
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- The following items are to be closed before the financial year-end by the 30th of June.
 - Credits on debtors account:
All credits to remain on members account and on invoice only outstanding amount to be invoiced.
 - Investment Account:
Journal entry to be done to correct and note made on audited financials.
 - Membership Subscription:
Membership subscription fee will be discussed at forthcoming strategic meeting and then tabled at the AGM in August.
An increase of between 5% and 6% was discussed and will be confirmed at the Bosberaad.
- The SANIRE President thanked MPAS for their excellent work towards the SANIRE financials recovery rate success and noted that a 97% recovery has never been reached in SANIRE's history.
